The National Committee for the Eradication of FGM in Egypt

In May 2019 The National Committee for the Eradication of FGM was established jointly and co-chaired by the National Council for Women(NCW) and the National Council for Childhood and Motherhood (NCCM).







Committee Mandate and Working Groups

COMMITTEE MANDATE

- Propose & discuss legislation, public policies, & relevant international & regional conventions & work on the implementation of the law
- Exchange information, assessing the exerted efforts & challenges facing different stakeholders, & proposing solutions.
- Revising relevant national strategies & directives, in addition to the national, regional & international framework & working papers & extracting goals to be submitted to the committee's Chairs.
- Agreeing on the general framework, pillars and directives of the activities, tools for implementation & monitoring.
- Proposing & developing national action plans that gathers activities from concerned stakeholders & civil society.
- Proposing resources for funding of the plan's activities.
- Endorsing the National plan, and supervising & monitoring its implementation with the concerned stakeholders.

- Received 1798 inquiries on 54 activities through the lawyers of the office on the sidelines of the door knocking campaigns.






Knocking doors Campaign

Implementing 679 door-knocking campaigns nationwide in 2019 and 2020, with 18,767,627 beneficiaries are as follows:





































International and regional cooperation

Regional conference on the elimination of child marriage and female genital mutilation was organized in July 2019, in cooperation with the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and the African Union, the European Union partnership, UNICEF and UNFPA, and Plan International in Egypt.

The conference developed the Cairo Call to Action for the Elimination of Child Marriage and Female Genital Mutilation in Africa.

During the conference, "Creative Egyptian Women" exhibition was organized by 11 exhibitors from different regions in Egypt.

The conference reached out to 1,200 individuals over 2 days.









The Egyptian Cabinet approved the draft law submitted by the committee- after studying and reviewing of the Ministry of Justice-, the Draft Law suggested amending articles (242 bis ,242 bis A) as follow:

- Omitting any reference to the use of medical justification, as well as Article 61 to counter any attempts to circumvent the enforcement of the penalty of FGM
- Setting a specific description/definition of the act of female genital mutilation
- Introducing independent penalties for the doctors and members of medical & nursing staff as well as imposing sanctions on the facility or the establishment where the crime was committed in addition to sanctions relating to dismissing the preparator from practicing his/her profession and publishing the sentence in a widespread newspapers and websites.
- Aggravating the penalties for whoever committed the crime, and thus allow the judge to impose more strict
 punishments and severe punishments if the act of FGM resulted in permanent disability or the death of the victim.
- Aggravating the penalty for anyone who requests FGM and is committed at his/her request, placing a deterrent punishment
- Introducing penalties to incriminate anyone who promoted, advocated, encouraged or incited to commit the crime





Counseling and protection pillar

The number of calls to the hotline reached 1618 reports from the beginning of the campaign in June 2019 until the end of December 2020

(223 report of which 185 report for cases that didn't undergo FGM, 38 report on cases that have done FGM & 1395 consultations)








Future Steps of the National Committee for Eradication of FGM in Egypt

An National Action plan (NAP) for the work of the National Committee for the Eradication of Female Genital Mutilation has been developed








Future Steps of the National Committee for Eradication of FGM in Egypt

Survey on the Perception of FGM and the upcoming DHS in Egypt

Announcing the launch of a survey on the phenomenon of FGM in cooperation with the Central Agency for Public Mobilization and Statistics(CAPMAS), and in partnership with the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA) and the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF), provided that the study will be completed and official final statistics will be announced by the end of 2021.
